SPSF POWER UP PROJECTS

- COUGAR COFFEE CART** at VINCENT MASSEY: Students in FLS learn life skills with the COUGAR COFFEE CART and serve coffee to teachers at VINCENT MASSEY
- ENTREPRENEURSHIP** 30 students at MARION M. GRAHAM learned how to run a business through their SCHOOL STORE
- LAKERIDGE & WILLOWGROVE CULTURE CAMP** where students learned the Moose Hide Tanning process
- BEDFORD ROAD DRUM-MAKING** students went to a 2-day workshop on DRUM-MAKING and the drums were used in a student drumming group
- MONTGOMERY LASER CUTTER** Students at MONTGOMERY learned how to use a LASER CUTTER and produced materials worth \$80,000 for SPS schools
- MOUNT ROYAL PROJECT HORSE POWER** 58 students at MOUNT ROYAL restored a truck as part of PROJECT HORSE POWER

- MECHATRONICS 3D PRINTER AT CENTENNIAL** Students practiced MECHATRONICS and assembled and used a 3D PRINTER AT CENTENNIAL
- ACTIVATE AT ESTEY** Students engage in activities with ACTIVATE to build kinship and develop emotional regulation skills
